THE FAIRWAY FIVE TRAIL RACE 2025

Sunday 2nd November saw the second running of the Fairway Five, a five mile trail race organised by the PTA at Fairway Primary School in Offerton, Stockport to raise money for the school.

Race day dawned bright and sunny, by which time the organisers had already been out on the course for a couple of hours marking the route with new signage, funded via a grant from the Trail Running Association. Around the same time, participants were starting to gather for registration at the school in preparation for the 10am start.

The course is a five mile route, completely off-road through the Goyt Valley and nearby Woodbank Park with some steep climbs and descents throughout. Due to local development work, course was slightly changed from the inaugural event with the start moved a short distance from the school with the finish line just inside the school gates. Last year's event was a sell-out with all 250 places taken – this year the capacity was increased to 300 and entries closed just short of another sell-out with 294 runners registered to take part, with 244 of those taking the start line.

The event was a great success with overwhelmingly positive feedback from runners afterwards - the scenic but challenging route, friendly marshals and volunteers, positive atmosphere and excellent baked goods at the finish all attracted particular praise.

The overall winners of the race were Daniel Sutton in the male category with a time of 29:19 and Katie Kay of East Cheshire Harriers & Tameside Athletics Club in the female category, with a time of 35:52. Fastest Fairway parent/ carers in the male and female categories respectively were Stuart Nunn with a time of 38:26 and Lauren Massingham with a time of 50:06. Prizes for top three male and female finishers and male and female age categories were generously donated by Run North West. Timing on the day was provided by Crazy Legs Events, along with plenty of much appreciated advice for the race organisers.

Race Director Dave Cracknell said "We came up with the idea for this race in 2023, for the race to sell out in our first year in 2024 blew us away but to see the race grow and be as successful as it was this year is just fantastic. I'd like to say a massive thank you to everyone that's supported us and all our sponsors over the years, Run Northwest were incredibly generous this year providing some great prizes for our winners. Massive thanks also to Bill and Adel from Crazy Legs, without their help and guidance this race would never have got off the ground. Thanks again and see you all in 2026".

Headteacher, Alison White, said "Wow, what an amazing atmosphere at the Fairway Five. The event was incredibly well organised and I'd like to thank all our volunteers and marshals for all of their help to make the race such a success. This is a fantastic community event and it was amazing to open up our school to such a great bunch of friendly runners. The money raised from this event will be put to good use to provide additional infrastructure and experiences for our children that the school budget wouldn't otherwise be able to stretch to."

Overall the race was a great success raising over £2,000 for the school, which will be put to good use to enhance the school experience for its 230 pupils. Funds raised from last year's event have paid for a new scooter shelter and a pantomime performance for the whole school to enjoy.

The organisers will be announcing the date of the 2026 event soon, and are hoping for an event every bit as successful as this year's.
