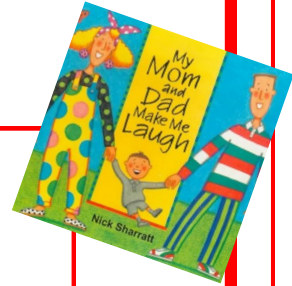


Nursery Newsletter 5



Autumn2: Real-life heroes don't wear capes!

As we move through our topic this term, children will be beginning to learn about the heroes we have who live and work in our community. We are lucky to be having some of our children's parents visit from the police service and those who work in the NHS!

Last Week's Learning:

- ◇ Our Drawing Club Book for these past few weeks has been Supertato, Veggies Assemble. Children have loved creating their own SuperVeg and thinking about the type of characters they are, where they would be found and what the Supertato characters might say! I've seen some brilliant drawing and writing from the children! Have you heard the children using their new Drawing Club Vocab? (wicked, cunning, frantic, pounced, courageous and secure)
- ◇ My Mum and Dad Make Me Laugh! A book about two parents—one who loves stripes and the other spots. Their clothes and home are covered in the patterns! Children have looked at and talked about patterns in the environment, created lots of patterns in the creative area by printing and with play dough and talked about patterns on their mini-me superhero capes. We looked at patterns on clothes and dug out spare and very clean underpants to decide which had patterns and which had a picture with the books Aliens love Underpants and Monsters love Underpants as an added hook!
- ◇ In PE—superhero travelling, stretching, drama and yoga, rolling on mats and making shapes and patterns with ribbon sticks!
- ◇ Phonics—Body Percussion - using body to create sounds (clap, tap) and will be talking about the types of sounds they make. What dynamic does it have (volume), duration (length) Pitch (high/low)
- ◆ Superheroes in school—how do the grown ups help you in school and your family at home? Making thank you cards to deliver to them to show we are grateful (and making cards for superheroes at home) with a focus on saying why we are thankful? And beginning to use name cards to write our name.
- ◆ This week and next children will learn more about superheroes in our community—what do we do if we are frightened or need help?—we might shout 'help' or ring for help and the police will come! What if we are hurt or poorly? Who will help? Where would we go? How would we get there? What would they wear? How would we recognise one? How can we help ourselves stay safe or stay well?
- ◆ Healthy Eating Options: we have talked to children about making healthy choices when eating and drinking and the importance of trying new healthy foods
- ◆ ~~Who is special to you? children will be invited to talk about people in the community who are special to them and why they are special. We talked about how Moses~~
