Children have been enjoying the transport theme How will we get there? Here are some of the activities linked with the topic as well as some additional learning about special people in the lives of people who follow a religion as well as hearing about each others.

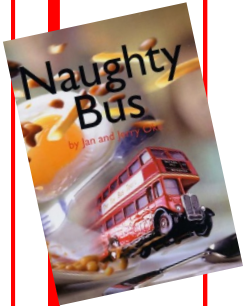
Nursery 2:

- ◇ Role Play in the Pit Stop Café! What is your role? Who is your character? What will happen next? Develop play with friends, sharing ideas, resources and using resources carefully.
- ◇ Junk Model Vehicles—All children have been learning how to use different tools and techniques to build their own junk model vehicles! We've loved seeing how imaginative, creative and skilful they have been!
- ◇ N2: Drawing Club—in Nursery we LOVE Drawing Club! Children have learnt to draw some of the characters from the book and thought about and drawn a vehicle they might travel in too. They thought about the lines used (straight curved or patterned) and the shapes they may need to draw to create them:-)
- ◇ The current Drawing Club book is Naughty Bus! Listen out for new vocabulary children will learn and the adventures he gets up to, they should include: thrilled, furious, careless, murky, regretful
- ◇ Children loved big vehicle play whilst outside. This has had to involve lots of careful sharing and negotiating with a little problem solving too .
- ◇ In maths children have begun to learn how to describe where an object is in relation to another! So rather than say 'there' children are encouraged to use positional language such as inside, on top of, next to, underneath
- ◇ In PE N2 children have loved using the benches and mats to explore travelling in different ways and N1 children have been learning about space and moving safely in a space through song and story
- ◇ To help them develop better hand control when mark making children will be shown how to complete dot to dot pictures

Nursery 1

- * With the help of teachers and older children the focus has mainly been on learning about our new environment, having a go at new activities,, finding out about our nursery day and routines and building relationships with staff and other children.
- * Enjoying story and rhyming songs in small groups with visits to our school library
- * Singing number rhymes and stories

Helping your child at home...

Nursery 2

- ♦ Phonics—we have begun to teach children how to blend sounds in words to create a whole word have a go at home eg I spy a b-ird, c-ar, b-us
- ♦ Comparing amounts—to help children use correct mathematical vocab we compare saying one quantity has more or fewer (not less)

N2 Home Reading

After your child brings home a library and/or Bingo Book, one of them is discussed with your child in school. If you haven't shared the book, your child wont be ready to share their understanding of the story or book.

It is a really important learning opportunity for your child.

Please try to read the school book, at least once a week, then at a later date talk through the book. I cant express how much they will get from sharing reading like this at home. It will help build understanding of character, story, increase vocabulary and broaden their general understanding of the world.
